

It's the Principal's Say!



On 27th July we observed the 1 st anniversary of the demise of the late President APJ Abdul Kalam. It was not covered by the media and the

government was satisfied with tokenisms – a formal statement by the Prime Minister that Dr Kalam was irreplaceable. However, ordinary people and children celebrated the day with spontaneous enthusiasm. Thousands flocked to Rameswaram to pay homage to their beloved Kalam. I intend to describe below some of the lesser known facts about this great man (mostly from the book "The Kalam Effect" by Mr. P M Nair, secretary to Dr. Kalam when he was the President). These are things we need to know and emulate to be true human beings and honourable citizens of our country.

1. Dr Kalam used to receive costly gifts whenever he went abroad as it is customary for many nations to give gifts to the visiting Head of State. Refusing the gift would become an insult to the nation and an embarrassment for India. So, he received them and on his return. Dr Kalam handed them over to the archives. Afterwards, he never even looked at them. He did not take even a pencil from the gifts received when he left Rashtrapathi Bhavan. Think of this attitude in the backdrop of the Supreme Court order on 2nd of August '16 asking all the former chief ministers of Uttar Pradesh to vacate in two months the official bungalows that they are still occupying. All the previous chief ministers from the time of Mr. N D Tiwari and Mr. Kalyan Singh are believed to be retaining their bungalows even today. Our politicians and leaders have the bad habit of 'getting' from the country, often abusing their power and political clout. "One of the basic differences between God and humans is. God

gives, gives and forgives. But the human gets, gets, gets and forgets." We Indians need to change our attitude.

2. In 2002, the year Dr Kalam took over, the Ramadan month came in July-August. It was a regular practice for all the previous Presidents to host an Iftar party. Dr Kalam asked his secretary Mr Nair why he should host a party to people who are already well fed and asked him to find out how much would be the cost. Mr Nair told it costs around Rs. 22 lakhs. Dr Kalam asked him to donate that amount to a few selected orphanages in the form of food, dresses and blankets. The selection of orphanages was left to a team in Rashtrapathi Bhavan and Dr Kalam had no role in it. After the selection was made, Dr Kalam asked Mr Nair to come inside his room and gave him a cheque for Rs 1 lakh. He said that he is giving some amount from his personal savings and this should not be informed to anyone. Dr Kalam was extremely kind and compassionate to the less privileged in the society. He dreamt of every young person from the villages and poor families being brought to the main stream of a prosperous India.

Dr Kalam, though he was a devout Muslim, did not have Iftar parties in the years in which he was the President. In Indian context, perhaps Dr Kalam's most significant achievement was that he exposed the meaninglessness of religious identifications. He bore a typical Muslim name and did his namaz faithfully. But he was also a vegetarian, read Bagawad Gita and Bible, played Rudra Veena and listened to Karnatic music and songs every day. He was an Indian in the true sense of the term, one we all can truly imitate. Dr Kalam said, "For great men, religion is a way of making friends, small people make religion a fighting tool."

3. Dr Kalam invited 50 of his relatives to come to Delhi and they all stayed in Rashtrapathi Bhavan. He organised a bus for them to go around the city which was paid for by him. No official car was used. All their stay and food was calculated as per the instructions of Dr Kalam

and the bill came to Rs 2 lakhs which he paid. In the history of this country no one has ever done it. Now, wait for the climax, Dr Kalam's elder brother stayed with him in his own room for the entire one week as Dr Kalam wanted his brother to stay with him. When they left, Dr Kalam wanted to pay rent for that room also. Imagine a President of country paying rent for the room in which he is staying. This was any way not agreed by the staff who thought his honesty was getting too much to handle!!! Dr Kalam is remembered and revered by millions today for the sincerity and uprightness of his personality and love for the country, which I urge my students to follow, and besides I entreat God that our netas and public servants may learn from the integrity of this noble soul.

4. In material terms, the "People's President" owned precious little, save his 2,500 books, a wrist watch, six shirts, four trousers, three suits and a pair of shoes. Dr Kalam did not own any property nor a fridge, TV, car or an air conditioner. This is the earning of a man who spent over five decades in public service, including his stint as President of the Republic. He survived on the royalty from his books and his pension. When he died there was no place for him to be buried. The Tamil Nadu government was kind enough to give a piece of land to lay him to rest in

Rameshwaram. This is the simplicity and humility of this great soul. "A good character is the best tombstone. So, carve your name on hearts, not on marble." Dr Kalam has left an indelible mark on the hearts and minds of Indians in a manner few other public figures have in recent memory.

As I write this 'Principal's Say', it is the 11th day at Rio Olympics. India has still not won a single medal. Most of our stars have fallen by the wayside. 1.25 billion Indians were hoping that Deepa Karmakar would ensure a medal with her high risk Vault event to ensure India opens its account at the Olympics. But she came fourth. Congratulations Deepa! You did make us all proud with your daring performance. The deplorable state of our sports and games reveal the lack of will and determination, hypocrisy, nepotism and dishonesty of our government and sports officials. While countries with population of Bhubaneswar city figure in the list of medal winners, the second most populous country in the world could not win a medal. We hang our heads in shame! Dr Kalam warns the dishonest netas, "It meant people who are in high and responsible positions, if they go against righteousness, righteousness itself will get transformed into a destroyer."
